

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# Compliance and Enforcement

- Responsible for ARPANSA licensing activities, including licence application assessment, compliance monitoring, and inspection activities
- Incorporates the former radiation safety section and nuclear safety sections

### **ARPANSA Licence Statistics 2010/11**

#### In 2010/11:-

- 59 ARPANSA source licences held
- 35 ARPANSA facility licences held
- 39 ARPANSA licensees

Several licensees have multiple licences eg ANSTO currently has 18 facility licences, and 3 source licences.

# Stakeholder Engagement in 2010/11

- (a) 2010 Licence Holder Forum was held at Australian Federal Police College in Canberra in September 2010 with approximately 70 attendees
- (b) ARPANSA participated in the Defence-ARPANSA Liaison Forum (DALF), Canberra, November 2010
- (c) ARPANSA participated in the CSIRO Radiation Safety Officers Day, Sydney ,November 2010

# Stakeholder Engagement in 2010/11 (cont)

- (d) Bilateral meeting was held in May 2011 between ARPANSA and CSIRO to discuss the efficacy of the CSIRO licence structure
- (e) ARPANSA held a Public Forum on the decommissioning of the National Medical Cyclotron at Camperdown, Sydney, November 2010
- (f) ARPANSA provided presentations to the Australian National University Radiation Safety Officers, Canberra, June 2011



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### Regulatory Activities in 2010/11

### Inspections


A total of 49 inspections were undertaken in 2010-11 against a target of 60. The shortfall against the target was mainly due to the diversion of resources in ARPANSA in response to the Fukushima nuclear accident in Japan

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### Regulatory Activities in 2010/11

#### **Breaches**

The number of breaches in the financial year 2010-2011 was 23 against a target of 20. The number of breaches is lower than last year (31) and is part of an encouraging downward trend

# **Latest Developments**

### **Draft Enforcement Policy**

- Enforcement will be applied in a graded manner reflecting the draft regulatory response pyramid illustrated
- A draft enforcement policy of scaled regulatory response to noncompliance and prohibited activities is currently being developed
- Degree of non-compliance will range from insignificant to very highly insignificant. Degree of non-compliance will depend on many factors eg
  - Safety significance of the non-compliance, actual or potential
  - Compliance history of the licensee
  - Actions taken by licensee to rectify the non-compliance

# Latest Developments (cont)

### **Draft Enforcement Policy**

- Response to a non-compliance will be graded according to the degree of non-compliance. For a high degree of non-compliance, this could result in a finding of breach, whereas an insignificant non-compliance may result in a phone call or email to the licensee contact
- When a final enforcement policy is available, it is proposed to be made available on the ARPANSA website

### Conclusions

- ARPANSA is committed to periodically reviewing its inspection programme to ensure it s continued effectiveness, incorporating feedback and lessons learned (Suggestion 13 from IRRS 8-15 November 2011)
- •A draft enforcement policy is being developed with a graded response to non-compliance (Suggestion 16 from IRRS 8-15 November 2011). It is planned to be finalised by mid-2012
- •ARPANSA inspection reports now available on website. More regulatory policies and information will be posted on the website in the interests of greater transparency
